



Accredited degree programmes have also grown from 13 in 2016 to over 50 currently. Most of these programmes will be mounted in September this year as we continue to strengthen our faculty and expand the required facilities. In this respect, we shall focus on increasing the proportion of faculty with PhD qualifications. As we maintain our interest in developing programmes that are mainly technologyoriented, we are keenly aware of the need to mount programmes that are marketdriven and would contribute to achieving our long term national development goals as espoused in Vision 2030.

In line with the University's vision, mission and strategic objectives, the division of Finance and Development is mandated to manage finances and development activities at the University. Towards this end, the division has developed policies, procedures and systems aimed at achieving effective, efficient and sound financial management. This ensures excellence in delivery of services to students, staff and relevant stakeholders. Following the award of the Charter on 7th October 2016, MUT has seen enormous growth both in infrastructure and human resource, a significant phase in the institution's development.

The division has continued to offer financial support for growth and development in areas outlined below. A new tuition block and a students' hostel have already been completed and in use. Works for two more hostels is ongoing. Plans are at an advanced stage to put a Science complex this financial year.

The division has endeavoured to provide

equipment and materials for learning. In this regard, it has supported acquisition of 41,000 volumes of library books and provided infrastructure for Internet Connectivity to students and staff. An Innovators grant has been set up to encourage and support student innovations in addition to a work study program for needy students. The division supports holistic student development MUT through at sports, participation in community service, counselling services among others. For the wellbeing of our students, we have signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Murang'a level five hospital and the student clinic has been refurbished to provide comprehensive health care. The division has invested in intelligence gathering to enhance students' security. Most importantly, the division supports the catering department to provide meals at affordable prices to students.

To enhance student learning, the division provides for staff development through training internally and externally. Regular internal staff sensitization workshops are carried out in areas such as National cohesion. Ethics and integrity as well as Gender and disability mainstreaming. The MUT staff and their families are well taken care of through a comprehensive medical insurance scheme. In MUT we are undertaking various activities as we prepare to transit from ISO 9001:2008 to ISO 9001:2015 by the end of the year. The University has acquired an Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) software for Student Information Management, Human Procurement Finance resources. and management that enables accurate and timely processing of data.

We endeavour to support development of the community through involvement in community linkage and service as well as provision of opportunities for supply of goods and services to the special category groups. MUT has supported infrastructure development of proposed Gatanga, Kandara and Kamukunji Technical Institutes.





Among the activities included a 2-day training workshop for all academic staff on internal quality and self-assessment at institutional and programme level assurance.

The Directorate also conducted an exam audit to identify the main challenges facing the delivery of high quality exams using a participatory appraisal approach involving all lecturers, exam administrators and the Registrar Academic to inform the causes and solutions to such challenges. From this workshop, the Directorate came up with several recommendations that the university is now implementing to improve the management of exams.

The Directorate has also been carrying out surveillance audits on lecture take offs at the beginning of the semester and examination invigilation as well as undertaking a student-lecturer evaluation at the end of the semester. These activities will continue even as other strategies are also incorporated to guarantee continuous improvement on the delivery of high quality academic standards.

Industrial attachment is an industry-based practical training experience that prepares trainees for the tasks they are expected to perform on completion of their training.

The purpose of industrial attachment at Murang'a University of Technology is to produce practically oriented graduates that meet the required job-related competences in their future careers. It serves as a link between the University and various partners who consume services and/or products of the University. Industrial attachment provides an opportunity for students and academic staff to interact with the stakeholders and potential employers and thus appreciate field situations that will also generate information for curricula review and improvement.
